Call for Nominations

Deadline: Friday, September 17, 2010

Preservation Maryland, in partnership with *Maryland Life* magazine, seeks nominations for the 2011 **Endangered Maryland** list. The goal of **Endangered Maryland** is to raise awareness of some of the state's most threatened historic and cultural sites. Treasured sites are lost each year due to demolition, vandalism, neglect, lack of funds, and inappropriate development. Once they are gone, they can never be replaced.

The **Endangered Maryland** list features properties that reflect the diversity of Maryland's heritage of sites and traditions, and illustrates the threats facing them. Sites will be chosen from across the state and the final **Endangered Maryland** list will be published in *Maryland Life* magazine's March/April 2011 issue. The article presents an opportunity to raise public awareness, create dialogue, and find solutions for threatened sites.

Nominate an Endangered Site Today!

Nominating Criteria:

- Sites can include historic buildings, neighborhoods, archaeological sites, communities and cultural landscapes.
- Properties should be locally designated or listed in or be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.
- Properties must be in extreme jeopardy and have strong support in the community.
- Properties must have a realistic prospect of being saved. Inclusion on the list should help increase this prospect.
- Nominations must be submitted or sponsored by an organization.

How Do I Nominate a Site?

To nominate a site, answer the following 10 questions and submit via mail or email to the address below. Please limit responses to 250 words or less for each question. Only fully completed nominations will be considered. No materials submitted with this application will be returned.

1. Property name and address.
2. Nominating organization, the contact person, mailing address, email address, fax and telephone number. *(Applicant must be a non-profit organization or local government. Individuals submitting a nomination must have the support of a non-profit organization or local government.)*
3. Name, mailing address, email address, fax and telephone number for a designated media contact in the event of selection.
4. Property owner name, address, telephone, and email address. *(Property owner will be contacted for comment for the article.)*
5. Description of the property and its surroundings.
6. 3-5 **digital color photographs** of the site as it looks today – including A) the most representative view, B) the site in its surroundings, and C) significant details of the site. *(Photos submitted become property of Preservation Maryland and may be used in future publications.)*
7. Description of the property's historical significance. Include relevant supporting documentation such as a National Register nomination, survey form, deed research, and architectural or historical essays.
8. Description of the threat facing the property.
9. Description of the community commitment for saving the property.
10. Description of how designation as **Endangered** will benefit the property.
