Support for the Bond Bill for the Baltimore Museum of Industry

Preservation Maryland <u>emphatically supports SB920/HB1046</u>, which would provide much needed funding to repair and preserve the World War II era Bethlehem Steel shipyard crane located on the Museum's campus on Baltimore's Inner Harbor. This project falls perfectly in line with the Baltimore Museum of Industry's mission to promote and interpret Baltimore's rich industrial and maritime history that has had an impact both regionally and nationally.

The repairs to the crane that would be accomplished through the funding in this bill, including replacing the deteriorated structural hardware and applying a new weather-resistant industrial paint system, will go far to ensure the longevity of this special industrial artifact. Preservation Maryland is extremely supportive of this project and selected the crane as one of its annual Sixto-Fix historic preservation projects in late 2017.

The Baltimore Museum of Industry serves more than 170,000 visitors annually, more than half of whom are students, teachers, and chaperones. The repaired crane would serve not only as the gateway to the museum, a dramatic beginning to their visitor experience, but as a new visual landmark on Baltimore's historic harbor.
